- Hundreds of training hours

Coordinator Highlights:

District Coordinator, Ben Farber:

Reflecting on my first ten months with the district brought many challenges to mind and some successes. I underestimated just how challenging this new position would be. With all the challenges though, there have been many successful projects and assignments, some of which are listed below-

- Delivery/ordering of ERG's to departments from EMA
- Assisting EMA with radio logging and delivery to departments
- Working with Bailey Quick on grants including the 2024 AFG
- Representing ACFD1 at LSO committee meetings, and WSFCA/WRFF meetings
- Becoming dispatch liaison for ACFD1 and improving our relationship with LARC
- Resolving a temporary solution to EMS in ACFD1 with paging "fire assist medical"
- Assisting Jasmine with ACFD1 access to LFD Training Facility

- Performing ACFD1 SWOT Analysis
- Work on 20+ policies and job descriptions, some of which were approved and implemented
- Attendance to nearly every Chiefs meeting I was welcomed at
- Gathering of basic department inventory lists for Bailey's access related to grants
- Assisting with locating and hiring HR for ACFD1
- 3 WARM incident reports submitted
- 2 WWC claims submitted
- Ensured VFA grants would be legally possible for all departments to pursue
- Conducted a training for ACFD1 through Jasmine
- Produced multiple Performance Improvement Plans for Board
- Conducted and proctored ProBoard test for ACFD1 members's FF1
- Assumed management of Active Alert for ACFD1 and have added +-30 accounts
- Drafted 2024 meeting schedule
- Worked with Michele for the standardized Chiefs Report
- Assumed role of representative for ACFD1 in ARPA station bathroom project

Wildland Coordinator, Bill Turner:

- Built relationships with departments, agencies, and dispatchers, including the local Forest Service, BLM, and Casper Dispatch
- Point of contact for ACFD1 regarding wildland firefighting with outside agencies
- Met with Casper Dispatch to learn how they operate, point of contact with Casper Dispatch
- Work closely with the Albany County Fire Warden
- Assisted the Forest Service with local prescribed burns
- Attended various department meetings
- Helped ENGB trainees with their training and task books
- Assisted firefighters with task books and red cards
- Point of contact for volunteer firefighters to call and ask questions and assist them in finding classes/training/dispatching to achieve their goals
- Coordinated federal fire dispatches to get District firefighters and apparatus out on federal fires by helping to combine crews from various ACFD1 volunteer fire departments for dispatch when needed
- Dispatched out on non-home department dispatch apparatus as ENGB so that department's apparatus could generate funds for that department
- Work with Wyoming State Forestry
- Learning the politics of wildland fire
- Board representative for local wildland fires

Training Coordinator, Jasmine Parten:

- Partnership with ACFD1 and LFD to use training facility
- Created training calendar for ACFD1 website, to help with communication of upcoming trainings
- Coordinated booth at the Farmer's Market and created recruitment brochure for county to help with recruitment issues
- Assisted with coordination of 15 District wide trainings
- Created signup sheets for easy registration
- Send out upcoming trainings as well as add to website
- Point of contact for training questions and finding instructors/venue for training
- Continuing to create partnerships to bring more training to county
- Work closely with EMA to continue to provide large incident training along with other trainings

Peer Support Team:

- 9 members from ACFD1
- Team members attended 40 hours of training taught by Building Warriors (now Auxilium)
- Implementation of program and EAP for District firefighters, spouses and children
- 9 ACFD members/dependents have requested EAP letters
- So far 13 counseling visits have been paid, saving our members \$1950
- Peer Support pages has been added to the site for members to have easy access to resources
- Countless hours of one-on-one peer support has been conducted by the team to ACFD1 members
- Peer Support Team has presented to each open station to inform who the team is and why it is important
- Swag purchased to identify who is on the team
- Resource brochures, as well as magnets, have been given to the stations
- Continue to partner with Auxiliam for clinical oversight, additional training and guidance
